
RAND EASTER SHOW 1994

Three Prestigious Supreme Championships categories were awarded after two weeks of strenuous competition at the Rand Easter Show.

Horses and ponies were entered in many different classes, which included best of breed Arab, Warmblood, Connemara, Welsh Ponies, Miniature horses and General Breed classes as well as Transvaal Horse Society ridden classes.

The first Championships were the Open Show Pony. Seven Championships were contested and the best of these were presented for the final judging by a panel of expert judges. In the final reckoning only four ponies entered the ring as one pony was the recipient of no less than three championships and another won two. The ponies were all beautifully turned out and superbly ridden for this Supreme Championship class.

The following ponies entered the arena: Champion Purebred Welsh Pony Under Saddle, Hydown Olympic Gamesman owned by F Steyn and ridden by Samantha Maughan. Champion Partbred Welsh Pony Under Saddle, Woldingham Amber owned and ridden by Leigh Anne Marelich. Champion Child's Show Pony Working Hunter, Caegwyn Silver Lining owned and ridden by Gillian Jankelow.

Champion General Breed Horse/Pony In-Hand was Dimmock Dragonfly, owned and shown by Delia Gardner. Supreme Championship title went to Dimmock Dragonfly, with the beautiful Arab mare, Arabest Akkhira in Reserve. Champion Purebred Welsh Pony Under Saddle was Hydown Olympic Gamesman, owned by F Steyn and shown by Samantha Maughan and

Champion Partbred Welsh Pony Under Saddle was Woldingham Amber, with Leigh Anne Marelich.

The Supreme Championship Trophy went to Heatherlands Golden Girl and Chloe Webb, Aventica and Leanne Mostert, Reserve.

The judges could find no fault with the beautiful Heatherlands Golden Gurl who must be the most beautiful and correct pony this country has ever seen. She was Champion Horse On Show, also Champion at the Horse of the Year Show and the recipient of two prestigious awards at the Rand Easter Show.
